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The Klitschko Foundation is a charitable organization that aims at developing a civil society in Ukraine. Through non-formal education, teenagers and young people acquire important 21st century skills, adopt healthy lifestyles, become environmentally aware, and practice a project-based approach to life, school, and their future profession. Project alumni organize educational activities for peers and colleagues, thus becoming ambassadors of change in their own communities.

OUR VISION

We believe that a country can only be successful when every person has a dream and makes efforts to achieve it, as well as having opportunities for development. Active participation in community life helps young people find friends who share similar values, decide what they want to do in life and gain practical skills for their first job. Through informal education we help the new generation of Ukrainian changemakers become confident professionals with 21st century skills and strive to improve themselves and the community that they live in. Such people become role models for others, and the community adopts their values.

OUR MISSION

We strive to create opportunities for improvement aimed at young people who are changing local communities through their own projects.

My dear friends,

When we were children, my brother Vitali and I both had a big dream — to become world-famous boxers. We fought for it, and now we have both once felt what it's like to be a champion. After winning our big victories in the ring, my brother and I understood that each of these victories had been won thanks to the support of our parents, our coaches, our boxing fans and everyone who had once seen us as future champions. We knew that we could only return the favour by having the same faith in others and giving them the same support. That's why 17 years ago Vitali and I founded the Klitschko Foundation.

The foundation, just like a real teenager, has changed its image several times already, explores different directions — from sports to ecology and medicine, finds new friends and together with them implements new creative ideas.

The Foundation's team creates an environment favourable to the development of a new generation of Ukrainians — young people who take on responsibilities and realize that they are the driving force.

How do we do it? Over the years we have established our own formula. We restore sports schools for children, provide training for sports teachers and send sports equipment to schools. Every year we hold educational projects for active teenagers from all over the country. Together with schools from all over Ukraine, we promote waste sorting and eco-friendly lifestyles. We organize philosophy seminars for teenagers. We support students who are still on their way to becoming professionals and give the ideas of the young generation an opportunity to be heard and implemented. We also share our experience with other charitable and non-governmental organizations, so that philanthropy in Ukraine can evolve and be transparent and accountable.

However, the most important thing is that we bring together a large community of people with shared values, inspiring them to believe in the impossible and giving them strength to reach the top. Thank you for moving forward with us. And keep fighting for your dreams!

Even if we accomplish all of these goals, we will not have a perfect world by 2030. But we can have a better society and move to a new stage of development with people being healthy, having equal access to high-quality education, decent employment and economic growth, not being affected by the eco-crisis, caring for the development of their communities and building partnerships for the sustainable development of humankind.

Our mission and values underlie everything we do. They form a solid basis for the Klitschko Foundation's 4 key areas.

They are a priority for us, because we have been convinced for many years that these areas have a significant impact on the development of Ukrainian society. We plan to continue developing education, sports, active citizenship and international cooperation in the future, but we are always ready to experiment and open new directions in our activities, if they will bring us closer to the realization of our mission.

EDUCATION

Society can only progress when it is made up of people who have ideas and a desire to improve, to grow professionally, and to act. And this is only possible if they continue learning throughout their whole life. At the Foundation, we are convinced that education is the best investment possible, because by changing the way we think, developing critical thinking and gaining knowledge, skills and experience, we can build a highly developed society together. That is why many of our projects include an educational aspect.

SPORTS

What matters is the environment in which children begin their journey to victory. With our projects, the foundation strives to ensure that youth exercises in comfortable conditions and under the supervision of experienced coaches. We give young people the opportunity to train and achieve their dreams in sport. Renovated schools, sports equipment, educational lectures and training sessions contribute to an environment in which young people can exercise regularly, develop smoothly, and win victories with confidence.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

While working with participants in the Foundation's projects, we do realize that it's not just them we're changing. The effect is much broader than that. By implementing local projects, participants become changemakers, local leaders in their cities and villages, and bring about positive change in their communities. It creates a kind of chain reaction: Klitschko Foundation — project participants — communities — society. We understand that all our actions will have local and then global results, so we make sure that these changes are only for the better.

INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

We always appreciate the exchange of experience and the opportunities that open up for us from working with international partners — this allows us to create stronger projects. Therefore, one of the priorities of our work is international volunteering, cooperation with organizations representing other countries and the creation of projects that bring together people from around the world to realize common dreams.

The Klitschko Foundation is an organization that teaches young people to accept any challenge and to fight for their dreams. 2020 has become a prime example of how the Foundation's team does this. A year ago we were planning some new projects in the sphere of online education and were integrating more digital tools into our projects. We wanted to launch an online course, but we definitely hadn't planned to move everything online. So we can say that we foresaw the future, in a way.

Everything has changed since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic — from the way people live to charity in general. We understand that the pandemic does not mean that the world has stopped or that problems have disappeared. On the contrary — the scope of activities in which charitable organizations can engage has only expanded. Many foundations in Ukraine have switched to combating COVID-19. Instead, we decided to continue implementing our mission without changing our vector — if not us, then who will work on the development of education and sport, who will support young people and teachers in Ukraine?

At the time when the quarantine was introduced, we had already been working on our projects for two months. The end of March and April were meant to be very busy, because during this period we were supposed to launch the Success Packages, Zero Waste School, Realms of the Future and ProCharity projects, and the three-month Internship 11.0 project had already been going on for a month. Because of the pandemic, however, we had to change all our plans quickly. The team switched to remote work, meetings began to take place via Zoom and projects had to be reorganised from an offline format to an online one.

Although we already had experience in implementing offline projects at a high level, online projects were a real challenge for us, because we hadn't used such formats in our work before. Therefore, in the face of uncertainty, we decided to act cautiously, consulted with doctors, monitored the situation in our country and the decisions of various international organizations and countries and got used to the new format of project implementation.

And we mastered these challenges just as well. Numerous meetings with the team in Zoom, the experience of international organizations which had already implemented something similar and our first attempts, one project after the other, taught us what we should pay attention to in the planning of future projects.

Our main task is to embody the Foundation's mission through our projects, and during the quarantine they have all changed and been filled with new ideas, new formats for cooperation with participants have been implemented, and so on. In the autumn we decided to implement three new projects — #FootballPeople, Skills Elevator and Teenovation, and next year we have several more initiatives planned for our community.

At the Foundation we understand that despite all the challenges we have to keep on moving forward, because now young people need our support more than ever! Next year we are going to try using more digital tools to attract as many active citizens as possible from all over Ukraine to our projects and give them knowledge and effective tools to create positive change in their communities.

We are proud that for our graduates the Foundation is a place where their dreams start becoming true and we want to have more of these dreams come true in the future!



CHANGES IN 2020 CAUSED BY THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

SCHOOL OF SUCCESS

A 10-day educational online project for teens who want to be socially active

PROBLEM STATEMENT

Young people from all over Ukraine don't have many opportunities for self-development. The people around them mostly lack enthusiasm, so the most proactive teens tend to leave their hometowns to look for opportunities in big cities or abroad. By implementing the School of Success project in 2020, we started giving young people the opportunity to gain relevant knowledge and develop skills for the future through digital tools. We also demonstrate that online education can be interesting and effective. In turn, the participants learn how to create opportunities for the development of their own community by implementing their own local projects, and show that the skills and knowledge acquired during the online course have practical application.

MISSION

Help teens to reveal their leadership characteristics as change makers who will take responsibility for changes in their lives and in their community.


- **1.** Motivate young people to take an active role in society;



PROJECT CHALLENGES IN 2020

- **1.** Maintaining active communication online with a large number of teens;
- 2. Creating a team spirit and supportive atmosphere in the project's online format;
- **3.** Creating a new digital educational program;
- 4. Preparing a graduation party for the 10th class of participants;
- **5.** Motivating the participants, the team of mentors and the organizers during the project and once the project was over;
- **6.** Finding ways for successful communication and cooperation with the participants' parents.



Khrystyna Pleskanka made it to the School of Success project only after the third try. 2020 was the last chance for her to take part in the project. During the winter she filled out the questionnaire more carefully than ever and tried her best to make a great video, passed the video interview, and finally achieved her goal to become a participant of the School of Success project!

Throughout the project, Khrystyna attended lectures and performed various tasks in the team. The most memorable lecture for Khrystyna was the one on self-presentation and video editing, because the speakers showed the participants their mistakes and gave advice based on examples of their presentations and videos. Each day of the project ended with incredibly emotional self-reflection meetings with her mentor, Valeria.

"Mentorship taught me to be more empathic," says Valeria, her mentor, "because even though I wasn't directly involved in local Success Schools, I worried about the successes and failures of my mentees. Moreover, mentoring took me back to my School of Success days in 2016, which was a whirlwind with a lot of new discoveries and great memories afterwards. So I realized that there are young and ambitious people already snapping at our generation's heels, and this gives only more positivity and confidence in the future."

In this year's School of Success, participants had their own mentors — experienced professionals from various fields.

"My mentor was a marketing specialist, Anna Popruga. Our meetings took place via video chat in Messenger or Zoom. She answered all my questions openly and gave not only good advice for professional growth, but also some personal life hacks. And following her advice, I wrote to other mentors to learn more about other pro-

fessions, because I have not yet decided on my direction in life." says Khrystyna.

In November, Khrystyna successfully organized her own project, the local School of Success in Drohobych. She realized that her own local project was the best practical assignment she had ever had. The hardest part, though, was finding sponsors: she applied to over 50 organizations, but only 5 of them agreed to cooperate! And the most valuable outcome of the project for her were the changes that happened to the participants — some of them were inspired by the project to improve their English, some decided to become journalists, and some even started thinking of creating their own business.

"A lot of the participants couldn't believe that I had organized the project completely on my own", says Khrystyna.

Her father notes that his daughter was changed after the project. "I'm a school teacher and it's always interesting to observe how children behave. But it's even more interesting to see my own daughter change. After the School of Success project, Khrystyna became more confident in herself and stopped being afraid of new challenges and changes. Now my daughter does not hide her emotions and is very happy to meet new people."

Khrystyna, together with her Children's Parliament, continues to hold charity fairs and different competitions. All of the raised funds go to orphans, to children with disabilities and to patients with cancer. Khrystyna believes that it's so easy to do good things together, you just need to have the will to do it!

She is also getting ready for her final exams and is convinced that the skills and knowledge she has gained will definitely help her get a good score, maybe even the highest one!



An online project aimed at implementing waste sorting in schools and communities

PROBLEM STATEMENT

We have been living in ecological debt since 1970 — every year people use more of the Earth's resources than it can regenerate in a year. This year the Earth Overshoot Day for Ukraine is July 24. That is, if the whole world left the same ecological footprint as Ukrainians do, we would need two planets to survive. However, we only have one planet, and therefore we need to act now. The Current environmental situation in Ukraine lacks a strategy and national policy to reduce waste, as well as recycling points and basic environmental education (neither schools, universities nor any other educational institutions teach waste management). Because of this, the majority of the population does not understand the problems.

MISSION

To build environmental awareness in communities through a project-based approach.

GOALS


- 1. Promote responsible consumption in Ukrainian society;





PROJECT CHALLENGES

The Nokteniya team from Shumsk Educational Complex and Preparatory School has already implemented several projects on ecological development in their own town, and a great source of inspiration for this was their participation in the Zero Waste School project.

At the beginning of the year, the team submitted an application and was one of 75 teams from all over Ukraine taking part in the project.

"We received theoretical knowledge and interesting ideas from the speakers during the Zoom lectures. Our wonderful mentors and coaches coordinated the teams' work and gave us guidance in our tasks. It's also worth mentioning that together as a team we completed the Ecoacademy course designed by the Klitschko Foundation, in which we also involved students from our school," says Larysa.

During the project, the team presented its own idea of how to implement a local project under quarantine circumstances — an online conference. Together with the team, Larysa developed a 'Problem Tree' and a 'Solution Tree' for their project and used Facebook to inform the community about the rules of waste management and the sorting options. However, the team did not stop there: the next step was holding the 'I will save nature' eco-quest — in the format of a live event. During the event, students of junior and senior classes received

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useful advice on environmental awareness and were invited to take part in the team's future activities, which in cluded sorting plastic and waste paper, a contest for the best recycled product and cleaning up the city's territory.

'Clean City' was the largest initiative organized with the support of the Shumsk City Council. The main goal of the event was to collect waste, so the team brought together elementary school children to clean up the area near the school, while middle school students took the initiative to clean up the river embankment in the recreation park and high school students took on the task of cleaning up the most littered parts of the city. In addition, the group of younger children wore symbolic ribbons as a sign of environmental protection.

"We are glad that we successfully implemented our local project during the weekend clean-ups, but we will continue working on the implementation of other eco-initiatives," adds Larysa.





A free online course designed to help teens build simple daily habits of caring for the planet

ABOUT THE COURSE

The goal of the course is to bust the myth that one person alone cannot protect the environment.

Course Structure:

Lesson 1. The World We Live In

Lesson 2. Sorting rules.

Lesson 3. Minimalism.

Lesson 4. How not to be afraid of plastic?

Lesson 5. Eco-activism.

The topics are introduced by the course characters: Polly the Spider, Robert the Dove, Marina the Mermaid, Leonid the Worm, and Zero the Robot. All characters comply with the 5R rule. At the end of the course, students can test their knowledge by taking an eco-exam.



- 7. Promote internships in Ukraine.







PROJECT RESULTS





Anastasia believes that everyone can reach incredible heights if they believe in themselves and believe that they can change their country, starting with themselves. She has been involved in Klitschko Foundation projects since she was 14 years old. After her first experience at the Foundation, Anastasia decided not to stop there and took part in the Realms of the Future (2018), Voice in Action (2019) and Internship (2020) projects. She confesses that now not a year goes by without the Klitschko Foundation in her life. Anastasia recalls what has motivated and continues to motivate her so far to participate in the foundation's projects: she has always strived to fulfill her potential and achieve her goals. And the very uniqueness of each project greatly contributes to her development and learning. In addition to new friends and exciting meetings, she also gets what she participates in the projects for — experience.

"When I became an intern at the Foundation, I knew little about project management, but I decided to try my hand at it," Anastasia says about her first work experience. Together with other interns she actively worked on the Zero Waste School project, developing its program, selecting mentors, and communicating with participants.

For her, the Internship project is a journey through hardships, disappointments and failures, but is also about building character and responsibility. Changing herself, her habits, doing her best and stepping out of her comfort zone is exactly what Anastasia learned during her three months in the project. So now, she is afraid of missing a great opportunity and then regretting it. She always faces her fears; after all, even if she makes a mistake, she will gain valuable experience.

The Internship project gave her an understanding of how she wanted to live her life further. Anastasia realized that she enjoys public speaking, working with an audience and conducting trainings, because this is how she can convince people and explain to them that nothing is impossible and that the only limits are those we create in our own minds.

An educational online project aimed at developing communication skills through volunteering

PROBLEM STATEMENT

Communication skills are one of the main skills in the 21st century. Today it is difficult to find a field of activity that does not require communication skills. In fact, our every-day life is all about communication, and the outcome often depends on how clearly and understandably we can deliver our point of view and hear the others. With COVID-19, everyone has experienced what lack of communication feels like, and when you are a teenager and are just starting to learn how to communicate with different people, to express your thoughts in a clear and coherent way, to distinguish facts from fakes, to develop your own creative and critical thinking, then forced isolation only hinders the formation of appropriate skills.

MISSION

To help teenagers build necessary skills and, through volunteering, create an environment where they can gain experience and apply the knowledge from the training sessions.

- 1. Give teenagers basic knowledge and skills in communication;
- 2. Tell them about opportunities for self-development in the field of communication;
- **3.** Offer them volunteering experience with real tasks in the communications department;



PROJECT CHALLENGES

"You never know what this or that event will bring you, but at the Klitschko Foundation you can be sure that it will change your life completely, as it has changed mine" — that's how Diana Maliar recalls her participation in the project.

She is an 11th grader from the small town of Chemerivtsi in Khmelnytskyi region, where very few people sort waste, volunteer or organize events. Because of this, she had never taken part in anything serious in her entire life, but she had always wanted to! Several years ago she applied to the School of Success, but she was so afraid of failure that she didn't send in her application.

"I still remember the night right before the deadline: all the fields are filled in, the video is shot, but there's a dilemma in my head: should I send it or not? Suddenly the lights in the house go out, the Internet connection cuts off, and my hope for participation disappears with it. I took it as a sign," explains Diana.

Skills Elevator became her second chance, which she certainly didn't want to miss. And she didn't!

"On the first day of the project, I felt awkward to ask questions, work in a team with total strangers and express my own opinions. But everyone was so friendly and welcoming that the atmosphere totally got me. Some of the challenges for me were to manage to complete all the tasks on time, not to be late for lectures and also not to forget to prepare for final exams and for my personal stuff. However, the interesting and busy schedule was a

real pleasure for me, day by day igniting my interest in the field of communications. I got so involved in social networks, journalism, storytelling, design and copywriting that the project was like a fairy tale for me," she recalls.

Skills Elevator became a kind of guiding light for Diana. After the project, she realized that she wanted to be a graphic designer. Together with the team she created an Instagram page, and then she even started her own art channel.

"And that's not all! One of the advantages of Skills Elevator is the motivation you get from participants and successful teenagers. And on top of that you get an incredible amount of useful links to organizations, Telegram channels and Instagram pages. That's how I found out about the Coins for Life campaign and joined it. We collected obsolete coins at school, exchanged them for paper money and donated the money to charity.

The confidence and inspiration I gained during the project helped me organize a similar campaign at our school. I even designed an informational poster for it as a way to practice my design skills," says Diana.

After the project, Diana got rid of her fear of meeting new people. She shares the information she has learned with them and has already motivated several people to take part in the next Skills Elevator project.



A 7-day entrepreneurship online project for proactive and enthusiastic teenagers, designed to provide the knowledge and skills to build a business — from concept to implementation. The project was implemented in Ukrainian and English

PROBLEM STATEMENT







When she was a child, Karyna wanted to become a successful businesswoman, but she understood that she needed knowledge and practical experience to do that. When she learned on social media about the Teenovation entrepreneurial project for teens, she was eager to try her hand at it. Despite the fact that the deadline was only a few hours away, Karyna quickly coped with the application form and video presentation. After successfully passing the second stage — a video interview, she became a finalist, met the other "teennovators" and immediately immersed herself in the project.

"All the participants were incredibly motivated, the speakers were eager to share the content, the mentors were bringing everyone together and the organizers were supportive and helpful. The atmosphere was even conveyed through the camera in Zoom, and every time I turned off that camera and another day of the project was over, I was looking forward to the next one! Every day was special," says Karyna.

Over a week of active learning, she learned the secrets of entrepreneurship, presented her business ideas, interacted with experts and found like-minded people from all over the country. They are united by common values and a desire to change the world. In the future, Karyna plans to meet her team in person and to continue working on the joint project.

Participants received support in the project from mentors, who guided them toward effective working and shared their ideas and insights.

One of the mentors, Dmitry Pronin, notes: "It was interesting for me to take part in the project as a mentor because our future depends on successful teenagers, and I feel it is my mission to motivate the participants and to live these emotions together with them, to feel the energy of inspiration. This project is very important, since teenagers are not just staring at their smartphones, they get entrepreneurial skills from the world's top startups and businesspeople. It really inspires them to create their own startup projects — and not only them, but me too!

Karyna is sure that Teenovation has set her on the path to success, and she is already noticing positive changes in her own mindset.

"Now the dream of starting my own business doesn't seem so unrealistic, and public speaking doesn't seem so scary! I have an even greater desire to change our world, our country and society for the better, and so now I am sure: there is more to come, this is just the beginning of my journey," says Karyna with confidence.

PROBLEM STATEMENT

There are over 110,000 registered charitable and non-governmental organizations in our country, but among those that are registered, only 34,000 of them submit their reports. The Klitschko Foundation sees this as a great threat to the development of charity and civil society in Ukraine. Such disappointing statistics indicate a lack of standards regarding organization management, transparency and accountability, as well as proper qualifications and knowledge of specialists in this field. As a consequence, Ukrainians have little trust in charitable and non-governmental organizations.

MISSION

The project is aimed at improving the effectiveness of charitable and non-governmental organizations and to help them become more transparent and accountable.



Oleksandra became involved in charity about three years ago and immediately felt that it was her mission in life, as it gives her the opportunity to improve the world in which we live.

The best motivation for her is the result of her work. She joined the New World Odesa Foundation almost at the moment of its establishment, when no one had even guessed that such serious results could be achieved. Now she recalls the true happiness of the cardiac surgeons when the foundation's team bought them microsurgical instruments for surgeries on newborns with low birth weight. However, these are not the only successes of the team. Throughout its existence, the foundation has dealt with the purchase of rare drugs and surgical instruments. The foundation continues to work in this direction, because its activities support Ukrainian medical institutions and give people faith in a healthy and happy life.

During her period of work at the Foundation, Oleksandra noticed that modern charity — both in Ukraine and worldwide — has reached a new level, becoming an attribute of civil society, setting new goals, defining new problems and ways to overcome them. Philanthropy has changed and many new formats of aid have appeared. Charity has begun to gain momentum all over the world. Every year, more and more new foundations and charities are created. This makes it possible to cover many different areas and distribute resources efficiently.

However, Oleksandra also notes that people are currently quite suspicious towards such organizations. In her

opinion, a lot of scammers and organizations with a bad reputation have greatly discredited the field of charity. But in fact, there are many organizations that operate on the principles of transparency, accountability and efficiency. Such organizations set trends and develop the sphere of charity.

This summer Oleksandra took part in the ProCharity educational project. She believes that the project has greatly inspired her to continue her work. She realized that there were many like-minded people who were enthusiastic and eager to implement projects together.

"The people I met at ProCharity were really creative and not afraid to change the world for the better. It was very inspiring for me to meet the people who work at the foundation in Kyiv, which is similar to New World Odessa — we even shared our experience! The knowledge we received during the lecture on managing charitable organizations is fundamental to our work. It is impossible to build a fully effective strategy without competent management. In particular, great attention was paid to financing and fundraising. All the information helped me better understand the specifics of charitable organizations," says Oleksandra.

After the project, Oleksandra plans to expand the foundation's activities to other areas. For example, she would like to work more with cardiac surgery institutions, to attract qualified specialists from abroad and to open up more and more opportunities to provide quality medical care to young citizens of Ukraine.

MISSION


To develop critical thinking and value-based leadership skills among young people.

- **6.** Facilitate communication and bridge the gap between teens and the older generation.





Nazar says that the project started having an impact on him long before the first text discussion session. One day he came to his sports club and saw an announcement saying that the Klitschko Foundation had already sent out letters to the finalists. He checked his e-mail twice, but couldn't find anything. He realized he hadn't made it to the finals. He felt devastated and promised himself that he would try harder next time.

"After the storm comes a rainbow, and the more we try something, the more we see it," — these were the thoughts Nazar had on the way to his next training session. And as he was walking, he noticed that he had been added to the Realms of the Future 5.0 chat. It turned out that the email from the Foundation had just got lost in the mail.

"It was one of the happiest moments of my life, because then I once again realized how unexpectedly life sets everything up to teach us something," says the project participant.

From that moment on the preparation for the discussion group began: captivating philosophical texts followed by sleepless nights. He liked the texts so much that he wanted to write out every paragraph and hang them in front of him. Time flew by very quickly, and at the end of March the participants gathered for their first session. Nazar recalls the sparkle in their eyes and the shivers as they introduced themselves to each other. In fact, they bonded so quickly that they didn't want to say goodbye. The participants became a strong support for each

other. They still keep in touch, even with those who study abroad.

Nazar also pointed out that they were lucky, because due to the quarantine, the Klitschko Foundation's director Alina Nosenko and the director of The Aspen Institute Kyiv Yuliya Tychkivska were able to spend more time with the participants. It was their insights about self-reflection and finding their own way in life that he remembers most.

"For me, this project is about people, the ability to understand yourself and to open your own heart to the world," says Nazar about his impressions.

Nazar considers that the most interesting part of the project was the preparation of a local philosophy meeting. He had already had experience in organizing a local project, because in 2019 he was a participant in the School of Success project. But this time he raised the bar twice as high. Nazar managed to invite Mark Livin, a Ukrainian journalist and publisher who made his project special and shared his experience on how to find your inner harmony. The most important thing for Nazar, however, was the feedback, when participants expressed their gratitude and said that his project was exactly what they needed during quarantine. He says it convinced him once more that small actions can lead to huge results.

Nazar is very glad to have been a part of Realms of the Future 5.0, and is grateful that such projects motivate the people around him and light a fire in their hearts.





Then she took part in the Skills Elevator project by joining the Foundation's team of volunteers.

"Volunteering in the communications department of the Klitschko Foundation was another dream come true for me. I was thrilled with the offer to engage in real work and see the whole process from the inside. I was assigned all kinds of tasks: from writing posts and translating to designing and conducting interviews. Through volunteering I discovered many useful information channels, programs and online media, worked with Google apps for the first time and researched media to publish my own article. The atmosphere inspired me to work — it was the ideal environment for me," she says, sharing her impressions.

For the 16 year-old, this volunteering experience was a kind of first internship. This activity completely matches her life values: to gain more experience and share it with others.

"I'm glad that I have a chance to help the foundation, to become a small part of a big team. In addition, this is my first professional experience, because communication is what I want to do in the future," says Vlada with confidence.

Volunteering is an opportunity to combine self-development and helping others. It is a chance to understand yourself, to find like-minded people and to join a large community dedicated to charitable work. Vlada believes that by doing good deeds we can solve global problems and create the ideal world that we seek.



SUGESS BACKAGES

An online project that instructs physical education teachers on how to teach sports effectively and helps to engage students in active lifestyles and sports, both during classes and after school



Ihor has always sought interesting and useful opportunities for self-development and professional improvement. He found out about the Success Packages project by accident — he saw a post on Facebook and immediately spotted a great opportunity to try something new and spend time productively with like-minded people.

Igor, who strongly defends real-life communication, was upset at first because the quarantine meant he would only be able to communicate with the others through his computer screen. However, it turned out that his worries were not justified, because the format of the online classes proved to be informative and the atmosphere to be positive. In addition, the project allowed him to take his mind off the surrounding problems caused by the pandemic and self-isolation. In total, the participants were supported by four mentors. Igor's mentor was Iryna Cherhenets.

"Mentorship is about responsibility and about love. Being a mentor means that you are constantly learning. If I am able to create a real team in the course of my work, it means that I have successfully fulfilled the role of a mentor. Most of all I was impressed by the teachers, namely by their thoughts and desire to change, to improve themselves. This is something that inspires me a lot", emphasizes Iryna.

During the project, Ihor most of all enjoyed the module dedicated to innovative physical education lessons with korfball. He was also very impressed to meet Wladimir Klitschko.

"The project was an invaluable experience and opportunity for me to communicate with professionals and enthusiasts. It has also given me further inspiration and strength to continue improving even after something is achieved, to move forward despite any problems and to grow as a professional," he says.

Implementing the practical part was a pleasant routine for him, because he constantly involves the students not only in physical education classes, but also in healthy lifestyles. The lecture with elements of games and training went smoothly — the children turned out to be quite aware of healthy eating and bad habits and pleasantly surprised all those present with their enthusiasm. When the weather allowed it, the 'Happy Starts' competition with unusual relay races was organized in the open air. As a nice bonus, all participants got bright photographs to keep these memories alive.

"The much desired 'success package' was really worth the wait. The day after I received it, I tried out all the equipment as quickly as possible. I'm sure it will make our physical education classes more interesting and effective," says the teacher.

ABOUT COOPERATION AND SUCCESSES OF BSSC

In the sports sphere, as in all other spheres, 2020 turned out to be extremely difficult due to COVID-19: firstly, all Ukrainian and international competitions were cancelled, and then the Summer Olympics in Tokyo as well. That's why many of our students' dreams did not come true.

Despite all these challenges, the boxing department students were still partially able to continue taking part in training sessions and camps, and in competitions with support from the Klitschko Foundation. At the end of September, the Kyiv regional team, comprising of six college graduates, won two gold medals, two silver, and one bronze at the Ukrainian Boxing Cup for men in Mariupol, thus becoming the best team of the tournament and winning the first place. And Oleksandr Khoma, one of the College students, won a silver medal at the boxing championship of Ukraine for cadets.

Today it is especially important to encourage teenagers and young people to practice sports. Therefore, the assistance provided by the Klitschko Foundation to students of the College's boxing department is vital. At Brovary Specialized Sports College, we are convinced that thanks to the support from and cooperation with various organizations like the Klitschko Foundation, whatever the circumstances, challenges and difficulties may be, we can remain an institution that trains real champions and where each student has the right conditions for growth and development.

MISSION


Fight bullying and biases that girls face in sports by introducing new methods of teaching and sharing knowledge in the community



When Natalia learned about the #FootballPeople project from the Klitschko Foundation's Instagram page, she didn't hesitate to apply right away, because she was very interested in the project's topic.

"Nowadays many girls don't want to take part in team sports during physical education classes and don't attend sports centres and schools because they feel discriminated and can't fulfill their potential in sports," says the physical education teacher.

For her, all children are different, and as a teacher she tries to find an individual approach to each student. However, sometimes she lacks the knowledge and experience to find a compromise with them. This is why she decided to take part in the project.

This is how Natalia explains her motivation to take part in the project: "As a physical education teacher, I am concerned about motivating students to practise sports, increasing their interest in healthy lifestyles, and conveying my passion for sports to them. This may seem simple, but to me it's the main drive to find new methods and activities in physical education classes. I dream of creating innovative, exciting, modern sports lessons, but I understand that currently I lack experience for this, so I take part in professional trainings and classes".

The #FootballPeople project is filled with different activities: lots of interesting speakers, new and relevant information that teachers often lack, clear and practical methods for working with children and parents, rethinking your own actions as a teacher and coach,

working on mistakes in your work – says Natalia, summing up the project.

She especially liked the psychologist's lecture, because gender inequality is the No. 1 issue in educational institutions. Sometimes it can be difficult to convey to students that each of us is unique in his/her abilities, yet everyone has equal opportunities. How, for example, do we explain that rope skipping is not just for girls, just as football is not just a boy's thing?

Having obtained the knowledge she needed thanks to the project, Natalia now applies it in her work. For example, she has started involving parents in training sessions with girls, so that not only the coach, but also their families can support them.

"It often happens that parents don't find time for their daughter, don't quite understand her efforts, her desire to improve, to win. They think their child just stays after school to chase a ball. But for her, such support and understanding are extremely important, because they motivate her to push herself beyond her abilities and achieve success," says Natalia.

This project helped the teacher to reconsider her approach to physical education lessons, and she is not going to stop there — she will continue improving her classes.

Last year I was lucky to take part in the National Minority in Sports international training, which took place in Zagreb, Croatia. The knowledge I gained there is very precious to me. I discovered a lot about mental training for athletes, how to handle emotions in sports and how to increase motivation. I also enjoyed the tour to the Dinamo Zagreb FC, and the coach's story about how they educate young football players. I incorporate all of

this knowledge into my work. During classes with my students, we actively use mental maps and exercises, and the children really like it. We work both physically and mentally, and also learn to manage emotions. I am grateful that I had the opportunity to take part in the training, because now I use new methods and see positive results in my work.

A project designed to provide the OKHMATDYT hospital in Lviv with high-quality equipment that will reduce new cases of illnesses and the spread of diseases within the hospital

PROBLEM STATEMENT

According to a study by the GFK (Gesellschaft für Konsumforschung), 70% of Ukrainian children have chronic diseases due to environmental problems and heavy pollution. Most Ukrainian hospitals do not have the necessary equipment and are unable to provide proper treatment. This problem is especially acute in local hospitals that are far from large economic centers. Lviv Regional Children's Hospital treats children from all over western Ukraine with the most complex pathologies and disorders. Hundreds of children come to this hospital every year with the hope to be saved and to get well. However, the resources that the Lviv Regional Children's Hospital has are not enough to monitor all of the patients' vital signs, and this poses a great risk. That is why the hospital needs additional equipment to monitor patients' vital signs.

MISSION

Ensure that children and young people have access to quality health care.

GOALS

Improve conditions in the intensive care unit of the anesthesiology department, equipped for children who suffer from several pathologies, by providing the hospital with the necessary equipment.

RESULTS

In 2020, 'OKHMATDYT' Lviv Regional Children's Hospital received a PVM-4763 bedside patient monitor.

The new intensive care device will help doctors determine which treatment is necessary as quickly as possible, thus saving the lives of children aged from 1 month to 18 years old.



This year was filled with many different challenges for us, as we were the only hospital in the entire Lviv region to receive children with COVID-19. During the difficult time when the entire world was put on halt because of the coronavirus pandemic, in addition to the shortage of protective suits, we felt the need to retrain our staff to ensure work would be as effective as possible. And fortunately, despite all the challenges, our institution continued its work thanks to the support from volunteers, NGOs, charities and ordinary people who provided OKHMATDYT with personal protective equipment and food, and even gave us moral support. We really felt the respect from people, the understanding that our work is important — and this inspired us to develop professionally and improve OKHMATDYT.

During 2020, we continued our long-term partnership with the Klitschko Foundation. In 2019-2020, the foundation provided us with urgently needed sterilization equipment, and in 2020 we received a patient bedside monitor. At OKHMATDYT, the safety of each patient and ensuring fast and effective treatment is extremely important. In addition to the professional training of doctors, the support of organizations such as the Klitschko Foundation contributes to this greatly.

Next year, we will continue to improve our facilities so that every patient can feel the high level of safety and expertise of our doctors. Moreover, we will establish effective communication with patients so that those who need help can get it quickly and efficiently at OKHMATDYT.




BY AREA OF ACTIVITY
